Here is a list of many other flowers:

Crocus - usually yellow

Chrysanthemum - There are several kinds. They all have only a single row of petals with a brown center.

Cyclamen - These petals turn backwards.

Daisy - white

Hyacinth - The grape hyacinth looks like a bunch of deep blue or white grapes.

Jasmine

Jerusalem Crowfoot - little yellow flowers like our buttercup

Lily - The "Easter lily" did not grow in Israel in the days of Jesus. Instead the lily is more like a lotus flower.

Star of Bethlehem - six-petalled white flower. Grows  
in clumps. This flower opens at noon.

Tulips, ranunculus, and poppies - all tall red flowers.

Vetchling - Climb like sweet peas. They fasten themselves

yellow with orange wings on the flower.
